The Qualifier was backed by our own competition. We used all four arenas at Ingliston to the full, the busiest we have ever been! We have had many messages from competitors who enjoyed the day, commenting on the good humoured helpers who always had a smile! Despite the weather we have been able to continue with our training thanks to the kindness of Andrew and Fiona Malcolm. Andrew Hamilton, Aileen Craig, and Linda Penman have all been busy, along with David Gatherer whose pre eventing training was enjoyed by many. A dressage workshop was held at Braeface Stud , near Uplawmoor. Fiona Muirhead gave valuable clues as to what the judge would like to see, and helped many achieve better circles, etc. It was a very interactive session with Fiona involving those on the ground, encouraging observations and questions. This is something we will organise again.

Our summer training will commence at Gryfside Livery Yard and the schedule has a few changes. We have a new instructor, Lauren Hagen, who is a music specialist. She will be taking those who would like ride to music, probably in groups of three or four. This will be a fun evening, running fortnightly, with everyone welcome . We have made a contribution to the lease of the ground where the Houston Horse

Trials were held. Hopefully a few Intro sized fences will be built and we are (definitely!) hoping we get suitable weather in order we can jump and have the occasional dressage lesson on grass. We will be having our training weekend at the end of May. Each training session will be subsidised .As usual dressage, show jumping and cross country training will be on offer and we plan to have a novice session for those who have not experienced this fun!

Our regular trainers, Aileen Craig, Linda Penman , Debbie Rodwell and Sue Melady will continue to help us solve our problems. At the start of the season Debbie will be doing a couple of sessions to help those who enjoy showing their horses. She is immensely experienced, making regular, successful appearances at The Highland Show and Blair Horse Trials.

We hope to have a couple of members competitions at Houston in June, so fingers crossed for good ground. We may have to limit entries for the dressage competition, so bear with us. If there is a demand for this type of thing, we will put more on.

In April we have scheduled an Easter Sunday Ride round Houston, the majority of this will be 'off road'. Easter Bonnets (prizes!) are a must so it should be a colourful outing! A snack lunch will be served at the end of the ride.
